FUND OBJECTIVE

The Fairtree Global Real Estate Prescient Fund objective is to provide our clients access to high quality, international real estate assets that should benefit from capital appreciation while also delivering solid dividends in USD. We aim to outperform our index by analyzing the central economic and political drivers in the various geographies, identifying global property sector trends and studying the specific physical property market and equity fundamentals.

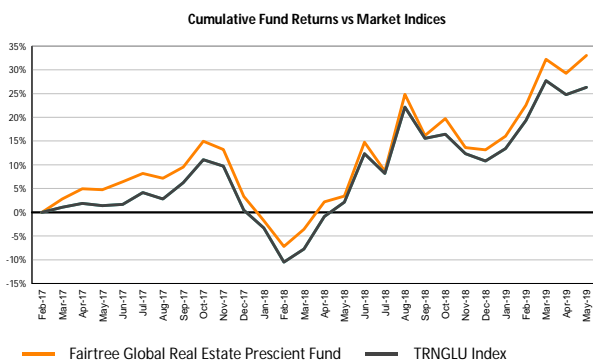
INVESTMENT POLICY

The portfolio has a long term focus, and is well diversified across geographic regions, currencies, real estate sectors and stocks. We will combine our top-down fundamental property market research with rigorous statistical valuation analysis using our proprietary models. We aim to lower portfolio volatility by adjusting the stocks and cash levels actively, while still outperforming our benchmark. We practice active risk management on a portfolio, sector and stock basis including the dynamic use of targets and stops. The fund will invest primarily in real estate equities in the United States, Japan, Hong Kong, Singapore, Australia, Europe and the UK.

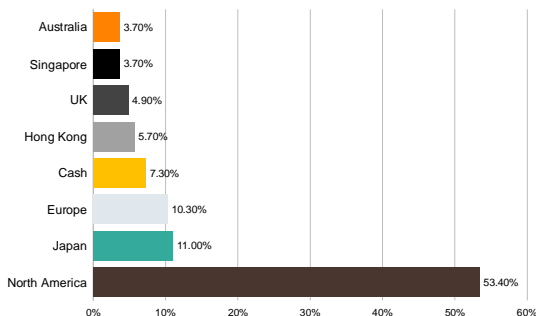

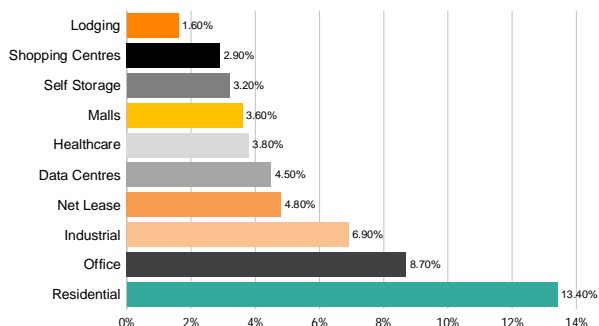
CUMULATIVE FUND RETURNS

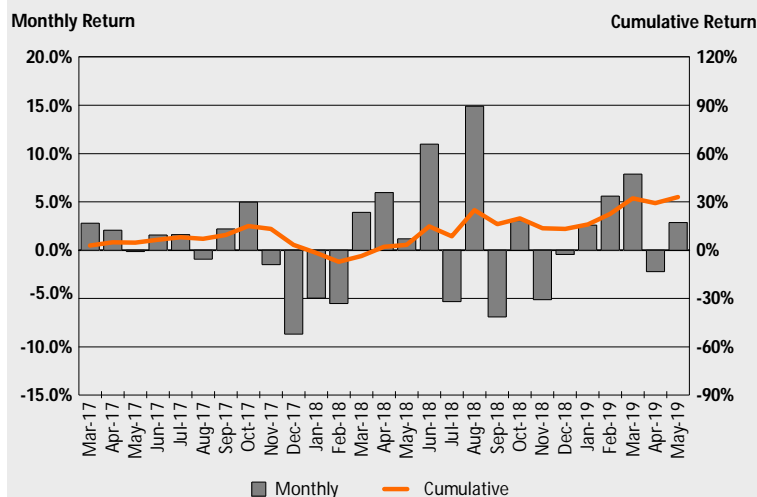

MARKET COMMENTARY

During May, we outperformed our index by 60bps* in a slightly weakening overall market. The US REIT sector did well to eke out a positive return in a month where the S&P fell 6%, so the REIT stocks have been outperforming the overall market of late. This is the best monthly relative performance for REITs since June 2016, driven by 10 year treasury rates that fell -37bps and REITs domestic focus serving as a safe haven from the US-China trade uncertainties. We continue to hold a higher than normal cash balance due to the high level of uncertainty in the markets in general, and the risk that the trade war has on our portfolio, particularly in locations such as Hong Kong.

During May, the top contributor to performance was Mitsubishi Estate, which rallied 10% in a day after the announcement that it would buy back almost 5% of its shares and would lapse a poison pill clause. We remain bullish on the name and the Japan developers in general on the back of attractive valuations and strong Tokyo office property fundamentals. The second largest contributor to performance was Welltower, the US healthcare stock, aided by falling US treasury yields for this largely triple net stock. The third largest contributor to performance was Equinix, which has been a stellar performer for us all year. The industrial stock winners from April, Prologis and Rexford, had a tougher time in May because of the trade war tensions.

On the negative side of the ledger, the two largest negative detractors come from the trade war sensitive Hong Kong and Singapore. The largest detractor from performance was City Developments, which has suffered on the back of tight legislation by the government combined with weak GDP growth and the growing threat of trade tensions. We have decided to stick with the stock given it is almost 2 STD cheap on our valuation metrics. Sun Hung Kai Properties has also had a torrid time as Hong Kong faces the impact of the trade wars and the resignation of the Chairman of a competitor rekindled worries over succession. Rounding out the losers is Simon Property Group, the huge US retail landlord which continues to face the industry challenges of e-commerce. We need to keep an eye on both City and Simon as this is their 2nd month in a row on the losers list.

Looking forward, following a timely trip to Asia, we have become more cautious of Hong Kong, where we now have an UW position on the back of a challenging economic environment combined with relatively expensive valuations. We have moved up to EW in Japan where fundamentals are attractive and valuations for the developers are cheap, while tempering our enthusiasm on the back of Japan's economy and demographics. We remain comfortable with our underweight position in Europe, where the outlook for the economy remains challenging, and our overweight position in Singapore on the back of attractive valuations. We are slightly underweight Australia after taking some profit after strong runs in the share prices. We are equal weight the UK, but via non-traditional sectors namely self-storage and industrials on the back of weak GDP growth and an uncertain outlook for Brexit. Within the US, our largest overweight remains residential, followed by industrial, datacentres and office, while we are underweight retail, lodging and healthcare.

NAV	The net asset value represents the assets of a Fund less its liabilities.
Alpha	Denoted the outperformance of the fund over the benchmark.
Sharpe Ratio	The Sharpe ratio is used to indicate the excess return the portfolio delivers over the risk free rate per unit of risk adopted by the fund.
Sortino Ratio	The Sortino Ratio is used to measure the risk-adjusted return of the fund.
Standard Deviation	The deviation of the return stream relative to its own average.
Max Drawdown	The maximum peak to trough loss suffered by the Fund since inception.
Max Gain	Largest increase in any single month.
% Positive Month	The percentage of months since inception where the Fund has delivered positive return.
