
RISK INDICATOR DEFINITION



MARKET COMMENTARY

Our bellwether iTraxx Crossover 5 year spread index wilted over the month. Having started the period at 346 basis points (bps), the index rallied for the first half of the month hitting an intra-month low of 309 bps before reversing all of the gains and selling off to reach its monthly high of 369bps at the end of the month. What had started out as a good month in total return, ended the period in the red, posting a disappointing -0.76%.

The 2 times levered index, our preferred deployment of risk capital, snatched some 1.53% from investors' wallets which wasn't a particularly good outcome. But when one considers that this levered index is akin to equity risk, it becomes comparable on an almost one for one basis. The SX5E, Europe's answer to the large cap Dow Jones index, delivered a rather shocking -7.37% during the period. That showing puts the SX5E down some 21% on a year to date basis and when one considers that the 2* levered index is only down 13.4%, one could conclude that it hasn't been that bad for European credit after all.

There were 2 notable defaults during October and both were domiciled in Europe. The Selecta Group triggered a bankruptcy even on the 8th of October and the default auction on the 20th settled at a recovery of 51.625%. The name was in the iTraxx Crossover index series 22-33 but was excluded from the on the run Series 34. Scandinavian Airlines Systems triggered a restructuring event on the 23rd but the name does not appear in any of the 5 existing 5 year cohorts.

The fund delivered 0.33% over the period, comfortably outperforming its stated benchmark.

GLOSSARY

Annualised Performance: Annualised performance show longer term performance rescaled to a 1 year period. Annualised performance is the average return per year over the period. Actual annual figures are available to the investor on request.

Highest & Lowest Performance: The highest and lowest performance for any 1 year over the period since inception have been shown.

NAV: The net asset value represents the assets of a Fund less its liabilities.

Current Yield: Annual income (interest or dividends) divided by the current price of the security.

Alpha: Denoted the outperformance of the fund over the benchmark.

Sharpe Ratio: The Sharpe ratio is used to indicate the excess return the portfolio delivers over the risk free rate per unit of risk adopted by the fund.

Standard Deviation: The deviation of the return stream relative to its own average.

Max Drawdown: The maximum peak to trough loss suffered by the Fund since inception.

Max Gain: Largest increase in any single month

% Positive Month: The percentage of months since inception where the Fund has delivered positive return.

Average Duration: The weighted average duration of all the underlying interest bearing instruments in the Fund.

High Water Mark: The highest level of performance achieved over a specified period.

Total Expense Ratio (TER%): The Total Expense Ratio (TER) is the percentage of the net asset value of the class of the Financial Product incurred as expenses relating to the administration of the Financial Product.

Performance fee incl. in TER (%) PF (%): The Performance Fee is a payment made to the Fund Manager for generating positive returns and is generally calculated as percentage of investment profits, often both realized and unrealized.

Transaction Costs (TIC%): The Transaction Costs (TC) is the percentage of the net asset value of the Financial Product incurred as costs relating to the buying and selling of the assets underlying the Financial Product.
